

## Peter Fisher

1995 - Football, Indoor Track, Baseball



While Peter Fisher starred in multiple sports, it was his exploits on the baseball diamond that carried him beyond Stoneham High School. The 1995 graduate was a tri-captain of the 1994 football team that won the Middlesex League Championship and State Championship that went 7-4 overall with Fisher being selected as a Boston Globe and Herald All Scholastic.

In his senior year he was named Middlesex League MVP. In baseball he made an impact in his sophomore year while the Spartans went 20-0. They became Middlesex League Champions and Fisher was named to the All-League Team for his 5-1 record on the mound with a 0.67 ERA.

During his junior year he was a member of the Eastern Mass. Division II North Champions and went 9-1 on the hill with a 0.71 ERA, coming within one strike of throwing a no-hitter against Saugus, while striking out 17.

Showing a powerful bat his senior season with a .467 batting average with 27 RBI's, he pitched a complete game victory over Swampscott, a four-hitter with 14 K's. That season ended with the Spartans becoming State Champions and Peter again named as a Globe and Herald All Scholastic. He finished his Stoneham High School career with a 26-3 record with over 200 strikeouts.

As Coach Seabury said, "He had to deal with the pressure of the pro scouts watching him in every game he pitched this season." After graduating Fisher went to the University of Maine and then the University of Alabama where he pitched in the College World Series. Drafted by the New York Yankees in 1995 and the Minnesota Twins in 1998, Peter finished his pro career in the Boston Red Sox organization before returning to college at Florida Atlantic University.

He is currently a third year law student at Northeastern University School of Law and resides in Stoneham.
