A 1959 graduate of Stoneham High School, Stephen Camuso is most distinguished for his range of athletic ability; an accomplished athlete in three seasons of sports throughout his high school, postgraduate, and college careers. A standout talent from the beginning of his time at Stoneham High School, Steve was a three-year starter in football, hockey, and baseball, obtaining nine varsity letters. His presence and leadership on his teams was evident, serving as the co-captain of the football team and captain of the baseball team during his senior year. Steve was named All-Scholastic in football and baseball in 1958 and 1959, as well as being named to the Prince All-Scholastic Football Team in 1959.

Both academic and athletic drive led the SHS graduate to Bridgton Academy where he continued to excel in football, hockey and baseball. This brought him to the University of New Hampshire, where he continued to showcase his athletic talent, earning seven varsity letters. Steve has the rare distinction of being the last major three-sport athlete at UNH.
